Regina Golovina is a versatile cellist from Tashkent, Uzbekistan. She is a dedicated adherent of the old Russian Music School. Regina began her music studies in the Special Music School for Gifted Children named after V. Uspensky in Tashkent, where she learned to play cello and piano. In 1999, Regina entered the State Conservatory of Uzbekistan and received her Bachelor's degree with award. During her studies period Regina participated in numerous competitions, concerts and recitals. Her solo appearances include: performances with National Symphony Orchestra of Uzbekistan, with Chamber orchestras: "Turkistan" and "Singing Strings", and Ensemble of the modern music "Omnibus". She also was involved in different teaching programs.

In 2007, Regina was accepted at Temple University, Boyer College of Music and Dance with a full scholarship. She studied with an outstanding virtuoso Jeffrey Solow, who is a disciple of a legendary Gregor Piatigorsky. During her studies at Temple University she performed with TUSO in Kimmel Center and Carnegie Hall. She also took part in master classes with the world known cellists Janos Starker and Lynn Harrell. Regina and her friends gave the first performance to a trio by a wonderful composer Andre Singer in The New York Public Library for the Performing Arts. Regina is both an active performer and a cello and a piano teacher. She has about 15 years of teaching experience of various group ages.

After relocating to Southern California Regina became a member of cello sections with several symphony orchestras, chamber ensembles and other groups. Regina is a founder and an owner of a group of professional live musicians called OurStrings4You. The group successfully performs at any occasions including weddings, corporate events, private parties, proposals, bar/bat mitzvah and other.
